

The woman who hosted Jimmy Carter and Rosalind told BBC recently that she has very fond memories of that time. He visited a cricket game, went jogging with her husband and visited the local pub to have pint. He loved being there and "living like a local" which is the essence of our club's motto.

This trip was the very first FF journey to another FF club. After that, he met with US governors, and he urged each state to start FF clubs to build friendships around the world.

Today there are over 300 journeys a year to over 60 countries on 6 continents, with over 15,000 members enjoying "living like locals" as they explore the world.
